

Educational Opportunities And Other Activities in B.C.H.

I have not been around very much lately so many of you do not know me. I have had many years of experience as a packer, some experience as a ranch cowboy, lots of years as a trail rider, training horses, farrier and all-around horseman.

Due to age and injuries I have had to quit riding. However, I still maintain a membership in BCH because I care about the future of our chapter and the future use of our trail systems.

As a fifteen-year member of BCH, one of the things I have noticed is that many members fail to take advantage of all BCH has to offer, and the way you can advance yourself as a horseman. You may not see a personal need for some of the education offered, and in fact, you may never use it. But the day may come when

some emergency may arise that you find you will fall back on some of the training you have received, if not for yourself but for someone else. Especially if you ride with a group.

For example, as a personal preference, I always carried a variety of colic medicine with me. I did this for about ten or twelve years. I never once in all those years had to use it on one of my horses, but was able to help numerous friends over the years. My knowledge of repairing lead ropes came in handy on several occasions not only for myself but others.

At the meeting, last month and in last month's newsletter Patti included a list of educational topics for the chapter's consideration. As of the meeting last month she had had no response. I urge everyone to take advantage of any opportunity to advance yourself and your knowledge of the animal you are taking into the backcountry. Remember you are responsible for two lives, yours and the horse(s).
