





Newsletter Theme -- The Simple Things--

From Dee Dee Denison:

One of my favorite barn and yard tools is the Dura-Tech Stablehand Hay Net Filler. It is designed to be rolled, inserted into a hay net, bag or even a garbage sack. Release and it unfurls and holds the net or bag open so you can single handedly fill them with whatever you are needing to without a second person. \$ 35to \$15 depending on the online site. Schneider's on sale now for \$15. Just hang flat when not in use on a barn wall or tack room in the trailer.

From Michelle Eames:

Use a knotted piece of baling twine on your inside and outside trailer ties. It acts as a break-away tie, and much cheaper than other store-bought versions. I learned this from Carol Klar.



From the Internet:

Just google "Equestrian life hacks" or Horse Care Hacks and Tricks. There are too many things to list. But here is a list that is useful and not too long, from: https://printablepony.com/7-equestrian-life-hacks-that-will-save-you-money/

1. Homemade Fly Spray

To make your own fly spray, mix 1/3 water, 1/3 Pinesol and 1/3 vinegar. Yes, it's really that simple! Even the most sensitive, thin-skinned Thoroughbreds approve this fly spray (ask me how I know!)

2. Homemade Thrush Buster

Combine bleach with water – dilute more or less depending on the severity of the thrush. You can put the mixture into a spray bottle to apply, or for hard-to-reach deep sulcus thrush, use a syringe to directly spray the infected area.

3. Cheap Fungal Shampoo (and Conditioner)

Shampoo and conditioner specifically formulated for horses is expensive! But I've found that plain old anti-bacterial Dawn Dish Soap works just as well, and is especially effective against fungus and scratches. For a deep condition, I use V05 conditioner and my horse's hair always dries soft and shiny.

By making my own sprays and remedies and skipping brand name products at the tack store, I save more than \$200 per year!

4. Buy Used

If you need to buy equipment, look for something used first! Check out groups on Facebook (English Tack Trader, Western Tack Trader, High-End English Tack Trader and English Riding Apparel are a few of my favorites) and visit your local tack store's consignment area – there are a lot of high-quality, gently used leather goods, bits and more available if you're willing to spend a few extra minutes looking.

Need a little extra cash? Sell your gently used items online or through your local tack store consignment program.

5. Buy in Bulk

Many tack stores offer discounts for buying things like saddle pads in bulk – go in with your friends and take advantage of discounts like this!

For sprays and other liquids, I always recommend buying the concentrate and diluting yourself. You can buy spray bottles at the dollar store and the larger quantities are always cheaper than the standard 32oz with spray bottle option.

6. Recycle

Ever heard of "shopping your house?" – it's this nifty trick where things that are too old to be used in the house go to the barn. When my kitchen or bath towels get old, I cut them up and take them to the barn. I NEVER buy towels to clean tack or rub down my horses.

Have a pair of dull scissors in your kitchen? Throw them in your grooming tote. Those carrots, apples and bananas that are too old for you to eat are perfect for your horse!

7. Make It (and Repair It!) Yourself

Anything you're able to do yourself is going to save you money. Can you operate a saw? Make your own tack box and jumps! Can you sew? Make your own <u>half pad covers</u>. Love to crochet? Make a <u>fly bonnet!</u>

Sewing is probably one of the best skills you can learn outside of the saddle – being able to repair blankets, breeches, saddle pads, etc. will save you thousands over the course of your lifetime. And I promise – it's not all that hard!
